*How does AIEP support my student?*

*Who is eligible?*

American Indians and Alaska Natives  
(see definition below)

*Who do we serve?*

All students from Pre-K through 12<sup>th</sup> grade in the following school districts:

(Lead Education Agency)
- 2) Bastrop ISD
- 3) Leander ISD
- 4) Liberty Hill ISD
- 5) Round Rock ISD

*Is there a charge?*

No. AIEP is funded by the Office of Indian Education Title VII Formula Grant and Austin ISD.

Definition: Indian means any individual who is (1) a member (as defined by the Indian tribe or band) of an Indian tribe or band, including those Indian tribe or bands terminated since 1940, and those recognized by the State in which the tribe or band reside; or (2) a descendent in the first or second degree (parent or grandparent) as described in (1); or (3) considered by the Secretary of the Interior to be an Indian for any purpose; or (4) an Eskimo or Aleut or other Alaska Native; or (5) a member of an organized Indian group that received a grant under the Indian Education Act of 1988 as it was in effect October 19, 1994.
