

## PARENTING THE *Love & Logic* WAY®

Mary Ann Kluga, RN, MPS, LCDC, Leander ISD Alcohol Drug Awareness & Prevention Team (ADAPT) coordinator, is presenting Parenting the Love and Logic Way® during the spring semester of 2018.

This six-week course is designed to help parents nurture responsible, respectful children who will learn to make their own choices and think critically and logically for themselves, while parents let empathy and consequences do the teaching.

The course is appropriate for parents with children of any age and may be applied to any situation, whether at home, school or work. The instructional approach includes discussions, video clips presented by Love and Logic Institute staff, workbook exercises, and homework to practice "new" skills presented during each class. Any one is welcome; attendees are not required to have a child enrolled in Leander ISD.



- Avoid power struggles while setting limits
- Teach character and responsibility through modeling and the application of logical consequences instead of punishment
- Teach children healthy problem-solving skills
- Stay calm in stressful parenting situations
- Help children become prepared to resist drugs, alcohol, violence, and other dangerous
