

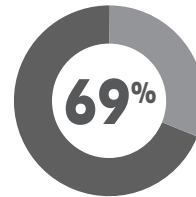


LEANDER ISD BOND 2017

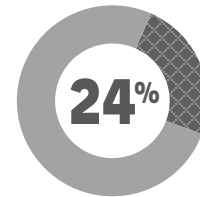
The Leander ISD Board of Trustees called for a bond election to address the needs of growth and safety. LISD serves more than 39,000 students across 42 schools and 200 square miles. The district is expected to grow by about 1,200 new students each year. Through a Bond Advisory Committee, the Board approved the construction of four new schools and funding to plan for projected growth for the immediate future.

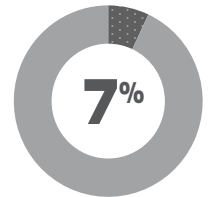

FEB-MAY
130 community volunteers built needs lists, collected community feedback
Subcommittees

MAY-JUNE
25 volunteers prioritized needs, worked with Superintendent
Steering Committee

JUNE-AUG
7 at-large trustees reviewed community feedback, called for bond election
Board of Trustees

ELECTION DAY IS TUESDAY, NOV. 7

Any registered voter living in Leander ISD may vote. If you have moved from another county, you must register to vote by mail or visit the Voter Registrar; updating your driver's license will not re-register you.

EARLY VOTING IS MONDAY, OCT. 23 - FRIDAY, NOV. 3
LAST DAY TO REGISTER TO VOTE IS TUESDAY, OCT. 10

No Tax Rate Change

Bond refinancing and pay-as-you-go structuring would not increase the current tax rate if voters approve the bond.

Property tax rates have remained steady at \$1.51 per \$100 valuation for six years and would continue to do so.

Residents Ages 65+ Unaffected by Bond

Property taxes are frozen for qualifying residents ages 65 and over who have filed a homestead exemption.

THE BOARD OF Trustees formed the Bond Advisory Committee (BAC), comprised of the steering committee and five subcommittees (below). The committees, 155 volunteers in total, met from February through June, studying demographic and budget reports; speaking with staff and parents;

and touring facilities. The district invited the community to provide input through the website, a 500-person phone survey and public comments at Board meetings.

THE COMMUNITY-led process prioritized items that support growth, student safety and improvements.

Upgrade traffic gates to new district standard: Bagdad, Block House Creek, Cox, Cypress, Faubion, Giddens, Knowles, Mason, Naumann and Whitestone \$273,000

Relocate/upgrade recess, PE area: Mason \$576,260

Improvements on HVAC and other systems: Giddens, Steiner Ranch \$17,863,111

TECHNOLOGY \$38,730,000

Replace device hardware as needed: secondary teachers, students \$16,100,000

Replace projector hardware as needed: secondary campuses \$1,200,000

Replace device hardware as needed: elementary teachers, classrooms \$5,400,000

Replace laptop hardware as needed: elementary teachers \$1,000,000

Replace laptop hardware (>5 years) and addition to the template: administration, support staff \$2,000,000

Replace document camera hardware as needed \$750,000

Replace printers as needed \$600,000

Replace outdated phones (>6 years) \$830,000

Disaster recovery hot site \$150,000

Replace network infrastructure as needed \$10,700,000
