Period 3 includes: the rise of Islam and the Islamic World; Christian societies in Europe and the Middle East, Western Europe, Byzantine Empire and Russia; the American societies of Maya, Aztec, and Inca and their impacts on the Americas; the revival of China and the Mongols, tropical Asia and Africa.	Period 4 includes: the end of the Middle Ages and the beginning of the Renaissance, Reformation and Exploration; Africa and a new world economy, Islamic, Russian and East Asian land-based empires.	Period 5 includes: the American Revolution, French Revolution, Latin American Revolutions, the 1848 Revolutions; Industrial Revolution, increase in global economy; the Americas after independence and land-based empires in the Middle East, Asia and Russia, the rise of Imperialism and growth of the British Empire.	Period 6 includes: the crisis and collapse of the Imperial Order including World War I, Age of Anxiety, Rise of Dictators, and World War II; Three Worlds in the period of 1945-1991, the Cold War, communism, China and decolonization; globalization of a fragmented world from 1991- present; collapse of the Soviet Union and rise of global and regional organizations.
